Superintendent of Schools Report:

School/Student News

The Teacher Librarian at Little Prairie Elementary School has created a thriving learning hub and has been engaging students in Core Competencies with STEM activities! Students at Little Prairie also enjoyed a pancake breakfast and ham lunch hosted by the PAC group. The Grade 7 students hosted a carnival night as a fundraiser for their year end field trip. Over 200 people throughout the evening enjoyed the carnival and the group raised \$2000 through for their trip.





Tremblay Elementary students had a book tasting event. The students sampled delectable reads in the genres of adventure, graphic novels, mysteries, book series, and some tasty true stories. After sampling various books, the student then chose one to

read.

This month at Tremblay students took part in a lego challenge in the library. Students were given a random card with a task to design and build specific objects individually or in pairs. Students had to collaborate to share lego pieces, design and construct their creations!



The Grade 3/4/5 class at Windrem Elementary School is learnig valuable leadership skills by organizing and running gym stations for the k/1/2. The students are having a great time building their leadership skills and connections within the school community.

Dawson Creek Secondary School – Central Campus has been busy with the start of the new semester. The students have participated in bus evacuation drills, ski trips to Bear Mountain and staff from South Peace Campus will be coming over to assist grade 9's with course information and selection. The Basketball teams are in full swing and the teams are excited to travel throughout the region for games and tournaments.

Ms. Buck's class has moved into the portable. Her grade 2 students have been working on persuasive writing. The principal visited their classroom and students read their ideas to her trying to persuade her for a hot chocolate concession, a nap room, and a climbing wall.





In Mrs. McInnis' grade 4/5 class, students had a Book Tasting with a terrific menu of books and tasty snacks.


In Ms. Fradette's grade 1 class, students have been making observations about snowmen and what causes them to melt.

The K/1 class at Parkland has been participating in a story workshop. They built a wall of prompts for stories. They started by focusing on visually and verbally creating stories and are now practicing writing their stories. The wall has inspired learning for others. Many of the intermediate students have referred to it creating their own stories.



Students at Ecole Frank Ross have been participating in many activities around the book Spirit Bear and Children make History by Cindy Blackstock, including reading and discussing the book, making Spirit Bears, creating Spirit Bear bulletin boards, writing letters to the Prime Minister and a whole school assembly to watch Murray Sinclair and the Spirit Bear video. In addition, Mme. Gowda's class has connected with the Nawican Friendship Centre and is taking snack food donations for Have a Heart Day. What started as a date written a year in advance on Mrs. Veach's whiteboard turned into a beautiful response from staff members and students.





Eleven students from Dawson Creek Secondary – South Peace Campus are enrolled in the Trades Sampler program at Northern Lights College this semester. The students will have the opportunity to receive hands on learning in various trades programs including carpentry, electrical and plumbing. This program helps students learn more about a trade they are interested in before taking the dual credit or post-secondary program.









Pouce Coupe Elementary has been sharing their learning from teachers to students. The teachers learned about coding using Ozobots in a professional development workshop and then taught their students coding. Students from Kindergarten to grade 7 benefited from this professional development training.

Mrs. Schlauwitz taught a learn-to-skate unit as part of her grade 2/3 PE class and the grade 6/7 students are learning valuable leaderships skills by clearing the ice for them and helping the younger students on the ice.



Miss Hommy's Grade 3/4 class created an "Array City" as a final project for their multiplication unit.

It was apparent that students like to go to school at Pouce Coupe Elementary with 80 students being recognized as having greater than 90% attendance in January. Students received certificates and brag tags.

Moberly Lake Elementary has been busy celebrating the Chinese New Year, learning Cree language through a bingo game, hosting a Bring A Valentine for Lunch event, and inviting Chetwynd Secondary School students out to go ice-fishing.







Field Trips

The board gave final approval for the CSS girls basketball team to travel to Costa Rica from March 17th to 26th, 2023. The activities of the trip include volunteer service, sightseeing, and participating in basketball games and practices with teams from Costa Rica.

The Assistant Superitendent has given approval in principle to DCSS-Central Campus for a French Immersion field trip to Quebec from May 25th to June 3, 2023. Further information on this trip will be brought to the board for final approval closer to the travel date.
